

Instructions for Gathering Signatures  
on the  
**The Protect Girls Sports Petition**  
and No on Question 6 Campaign

ABOUT THE PETITION

In 2022, voters ratified the State Equal Rights Amendment to the Nevada Constitution. One of the unintended consequences is allowing biological males in female sports, jeopardizing safety, scholarships, a chance to play, and safe locker rooms and showers for Nevada's girls and women. The Protect Women's Sports is attempting to fix this problem – The Protect Girls Sports Petition.

Publicly funded athletic programs must classify sports teams and competitions as one of the following:

- Male
- Female
- Co-ed/Mixed-sex

To protect girls' sports, we must gather 150,000 valid signatures from registered Nevada voters to put this on the November ballot. Your help is needed. You can gather signatures and get us there!

What's more, your efforts can help defeat Question 6 - the radical abortion amendment that will be on the 2026 ballot.


**HOW DOES THIS IMPACT NO ON 6 CAMPAIGN?**

People who care about girls sports care about making sure underage girls seeking an abortion have a **mom or dad** involved. They are our voters. Getting them engaged in this adjacent effort increases their likelihood of them **voting No on 6**.

## RULES - PLEASE READ AND ABIDE BY

The rules we must follow are very strict. Any signature or form that doesn't meet the requirements may be declared invalid. Please read carefully and follow the instructions. Items in red require extra attention.

VOLUNTEER RULES (2 pages)	
1	Petitions must be turned in by <b>June 1</b> . Don't wait. Send them in weekly.
2	<b>Do Not download, copy, or unstaple packets</b> as this invalidates all signatures on that petition.
3	One Petition packet = one County/ Petition district. Every packet must contain only signatures from <b>the same County/Petition District</b> . <b>All signatures must be from the same county/district.</b>
GEOGRAPHY	
4	PETITION DISTRICT=CONGRESSIONAL DISTRICT
	• Packets must be <u>One County (CTY) / One Petition District (PD)</u> and only registered voters in that CTY and PD can sign in that packet.

5	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Start a packet and <b>label all signature pages the same</b> (COUNTY/PD, IE: WASHOE-02, CLARK-04, etc.) So, <b>on each signature page, add the COUNTY AND Petition District NUMBER (Congressional District) number.</b></li> <li>• If you are in ANY county <u>other than Clark or Lyon</u>, all packets will be the same county/district. You may want to carry extra packets for adjacent counties.</li> <li>• LAS VEGAS has 1 COUNTY &amp; 3 PDs. Clark-01, Clark-03, Clark-04. <b>In Las Vegas, please carry all 3 - Clark 01, Clark 03, &amp; Clark 04 petitions.</b> <b>Please verify <u>where</u> a person is REGISTERED TO VOTE. Use Link or QR above.</b></li> <li>• Lyon County is part of PD2 and PD4, depending on where the voter lives. The city of Yerington is split between PD2 and PD4.</li> </ul>

	<b>CUSTODY AND SIGNATURE RULES - VERY IMPORTANT</b>
6	<b>DO NOT HAND PACKET TO ANOTHER VOLUNTEER.</b> Only one volunteer per packet (Shepherd 1-3 packets at a time during entire event). Best way to do this at an event is have three packets in front of a volunteer to monitor.
7	<b>Do not write - or allow signer to write - stray lines or information anywhere on petition packets.</b>
8	<b>Signers ONLY sign a petition packet for THEIR County/District Number</b> Use Congressional District finder – Go to: ZIP.DefeatSix.com or use. (See provided zip code list for districts)
9	THIS LINE IS BLANK
10	<b>Keep custody of your packets &amp; observe every signature.</b>
11	<b>Do not help a voter fill out boxes.</b>
12	<b>If a signature or other signature information goes outside the box, or there are stray marks, draw a line through the affected box so no one uses it.</b> <b>If writing extends into the “This space for office use only,” strike through and ask the signer to re-sign.</b>
13	Signature volunteers must be 18 or older.
14	<b>WHEN YOU GREET A SIGNER</b>
	<i>The best thing to say when trying to get someone to sign is to tell them this is a proposed constitutional amendment to “protect girls sports and provide fair opportunities for all.”</i>
	<b>Where are you registered to vote? Point on Map.</b>
	<b>HAVE COPY of DISTRICT MAP ON BACK OF CLIPBOARD</b>
15	<b>Black or blue ink pen only. (No other color ink or pencil). NO WHITEOUT.</b>
16	BLOCK LETTERING is advised.
17	<b>If a signature goes outside the box, draw a line through the affected box so no one uses it.</b>
18	In Address - encourage signer to write city / zip / county (In the city county block)
19	<b>Signers must sign with address the registrar has on file. No P.O. Boxes!</b>
20	<b>Signers must be registered to vote in NV. To check registration or start. Go to:</b> <b><a href="https://registertovote.nv.gov">https://registertovote.nv.gov</a></b>
	It does not matter whether they have ever voted in NV.

	<b>NOTARY AND CERTIFICATION</b>
21	You must have the petition Notarized that you observed every signature on the petition.
22	Once you have completed a packet or it is the end of the week, it is time to get your packet(s) notarized
23	Circulators should attach a post-it note or a <u>note paper clipped</u> to the completed petitions with either phrase: <u>POGPAC</u> – or – <u>NO ON 6 CAMPAIGN</u> . DO NOT WRITE ON PETITION itself.
24	The last page of the packet is the notary page. <b>Do not fill out until you see a notary.</b> You will sign this page in front of the notary affirming that you observed all signatures in the packet.
25	Notaries can be provided, or you can find one at many churches, banks, and attorney’s offices.
	Bring a driver’s license.
